- C. Ordinance No. 2929 – Classification Plan Modification**
Ordinance No. 2929 is before Council on third reading and will amend the 2021-22 Classification Plan to include an Executive Administrative Assistant/Tourism position; in addition, modify the title of Outreach Services at the library to Technical Services Librarian. These changes will become effective the first payroll following adoption of the ordinance.
- D. Ordinance No. 2930 – 2022 City Council Meeting Schedule**
Ordinance No. 2930 is before Council on second reading and will adopt the proposed City Council 2022 Meeting Schedule.
- E. Ordinance No. 2931 – Dissolution of Park and Tree Board**
Ordinance No. 2931 is before Council on second reading and will dissolve the Park and Tree Board and replace it with an advisory board. Staff conducted a discussion at the most recent Park and Tree Board meeting to receive input on the proposed changes. The attached narrative provides background information forming this decision.
- F. Ordinance No. 2932 – Street Revenue Bond**
Ordinance No. 2932 is before Council on second reading and relates to the City's General Obligation Highway Allocation Fund Pledge Bonds in the aggregate principal amount not to exceed \$3,200,000, for the purpose of paying the costs of constructing and improving certain streets and related improvements of the City. Staff is requesting Council waive the third reading to allow for pricing of the bonds before year-end.
- G. Resolution No. 21-121 – Police Fleet Maintenance Services Bid Award**
Resolution No. 21-121 will award the Police Fleet Maintenance Services Bid to Alliance Motors Unlimited. The contract is for three years beginning December 1, 2021 to November 30, 2024.

H. Resolution No. 21-122 – Refuse Collection Truck Purchase

Resolution No. 21-122 will authorize the purchase of a 2022 Freightliner Refuse truck from KOIS Brothers Equipment Company for \$241,012. This purchase has been included in the 2021-22 budget.

I. Resolution No. 21-123 – Arsenic Treatment Facilities Equipment Replacement and Repairs

Resolution No. 21-123 will accept the proposal in the amount of \$202,030.60 from Layne Christensen Company to repair well valves and filter media replacements at the arsenic treatments facilities located at 18th and Colorado, Burnham Drive and on Elkhorn Avenue. These repairs have been included as part of the 2021-22 budget.

J. Resolution No. 21-124 – Backhoe Purchase Approval

Resolution 21-124 authorizes the purchase of a John Deere 310 SL Backhoe Front-End Loader from Murphy Tractor and Equipment of Gering, NE for the amount of \$127,620 to be utilized in Water Department. This purchase has been included as part of the 2021-22 budget.

K. Resolution No. 21-125 – Dispatch Services Agreement with Box Butte County


Resolution No. 21-125 will approve the Dispatch Services Agreement between the City of Alliance Police Department and Box Butte County Sherriff’s Office. The Dispatch Service Agreement defines the scope of work and expectations to include cost reimbursement for the Alliance Police Department to provide dispatch services for the Box Butte County Sheriff’s Office, Hemingford Police Department, and Hemingford Volunteer Fire Department.

L. Resolution No. 21-126 – Fire Department Training Facility Approval

The Fire Department has budgeted \$290,000 for a fire training facility in the 2021-2022 budget. Staff has worked with Fire Training Structures, LLC (FTC) for almost a year to come up with a training facility that would meet the fire departments needs and requirements. Resolution No. 21-126 will accept the proposal of \$284,971 from FTC for a fire training facility.
